# **Learning Bird and Classroom Projectors**

You can project Learning Bird resources in your classroom to introduce a topic, check for understanding, reinforce knowledge, and engage in classroom activities and discussions. Most of the Learning Bird resources are interactive by design, using pauses and prompts for student input either individually, in small groups, or as a class.

# Videos



- Introduce a topic by playing a video for the whole class. Encourage written or visual note-taking.
- Use prompts in the videos to stimulate learning, reflection, and discussion.
- Ask students to individually write down a summary of what they've learned. You can collect their answers or share them as a group.

### **Audio files**



- Project relevant documents on the screen while the class listens to a Learning Bird audio file.
- Ask students to listen to audio files individually using headphones (if available) from their personal devices (laptops, tablets, phones). Follow up with a whole class discussion.

#### **Presentations**



- Design your lessons around ready-made Learning Bird presentations.
- Complete activities in the presentation in small groups or individually.

#### **Handouts**



- Project handouts for students to work on individually, in small groups, or as a whole class.
- Print handouts for students to complete in class or as homework. Project and correct handouts as a class. If you have an interactive whiteboard, you can fill in the handout as you go.

## Tips:

- Design your classroom layout so that all students have a clear view of the screen and can easily transition to small group work.
- Set up your Learning Bird resources before class. You can add them to your Learning Bird class page or favourite them.
